OPEN ENROLLMENT APPLICATION

- Open Enrollment allows student to apply for up to 2 Specialty Programs.
- Open November 1st until November 30th.
- Application: http://www.scusd.edu/hsapplication
- Open Enrollment does not allow students to apply for a school's general program.
- Application automatically pulls student information and transcripts.

OPEN ENROLLMENT PROCESS

Open Enrollment allows students to select up to 2 Specialty Programs. An electronic lottery occurs when there are more applicants than available seats.

- If you get your 1st choice, you will not go into the lottery for your 2nd choice.
 - If you do not get your 1st choice, you go into lottery for 2nd choice.
- If you get your 2nd choice, you are not placed on a waitlist for your 1st choice.
 - If you do not get your 2nd choice, you are placed on the waitlist for your 1st choice.
- If you really only want one program, only choose 1 option.

To be entered into the lottery for any selected program, students must meet the required criteria, if there is a specified criteria.

CRITERIA BASED SPECIALTY PROGRAMS

- There are FOUR Specialty Programs that require additional assessment criteria. Students need to take action in meeting this criteria through a test or essay session, or portfolio submission: CK McClatchy HISP, CK McClatchy VAPA, JF Kennedy PACE, and West Campus.
- VAPA requires students to submit a portfolio via Google Slides. Instructions can be found on the VAPA website: http://ckmvapa.org/apply-instruct-inform
- Other programs require no particular criteria, and will simply fill via the Open Enrollment Specialty Application.
- An electronic lottery will occur for any Specialty Program with more applicants than available seats.

HEALTH PROFESSIONS

Carver is the first public Waldorf methods high school in California. Our curriculum is modeled on the traditional Waldorf curriculum: a four year developmentally based high school program integrating arts and adolescent development into all areas of the program. At Carver, the curriculum is rigorous; academic classes emphasize the development of independent investigation, critical thinking, and applied academic and creative skills that students will later use to contribute to their community.

Sacramento New Technology High School (SNTHS) targets individual student interests and the development of individual responsibility by teaching in a creative, business-like culture that values learning at high levels. The curriculum—a unique global perspective on learning and understanding—prepares HISP students for success at any college or university in the country.

Law and Public Policy Academy (LPPA)

CKM is honored to host SCUSD's program, the Law and Public Policy Academy (LPPA). The LPPA will provide students with a means to explore the broad range of careers within the field of law. Their courses at CKM will be taught through the lens of the legal system.

Air Force Junior ROTC Unit CA-841 (AFJROTC)

The nationally recognized Air Force Junior ROTC works with students who desire to develop leadership potential. This open-enrollment program provides an outstanding scholastic program in the areas of aero-dynamics, science, history and cultural awareness. Building self-esteem through practice and through responsibility is a prime factor to which students are attracted.

Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA)

The mission of VAPA is to promote higher academic achievement, develop marketable career skills, encourage continued education, and enhance the quality of life in our community through the Arts. Within VAPA, students will be provided with opportunities to explore careers within the broad fields of art, entertainment, and media; to understand the relationship between academic success and success in the workplace; and to develop the necessary skills to sustain a meaningful career in their chosen field. The experiences and training students receive VAPA will give them a solid educational foundation and prepare them for continued education and future career opportunities.

Criminal Justice Academy (CJA)

This academy includes all basic high school course requirements plus specialized training in the field of law enforcement. Students will study the basic course materials used by those in training to be police cadets. Additionally, the curriculum covers investigative procedures, forensic science, physical training, principles of the law and wireless public safety communication. Students will have the opportunity to earn FCC radio operation certifications. The Criminal Justice Academy is offered through a partnership with the Sacramento Police Department.



Air Force Junior ROTC

Air Force Junior ROTC program is part of a nationally recognized distinguished unit. The program provides instruction in leadership, citizenship, and life skills—as well as teaching about aerospace science. Students gain many off campus educational opportunities through field trips and drill competitions. Participants in the color guard or drill team perform at school athletic events and other important functions and activities.

Health and Medical Science Academy

Health and Medical Sciences Academy is a pathway for students that are considering careers in the medical field, where plenty of opportunities await them. Do you dream of someday becoming a doctor or nurse, or just being involved in the medical field? Are you interested in science, but do not know much about any science-related jobs? Marine Corps Junior ROTC
