Climate Surveys - Family Surveys by 3/6

The district has released its annual School Climate Surveys for students, parents, and staff. Survey questions are designed to measure perception of safety and belonging/connectedness. The survey results will be used to support district priorities, the actions in the LCAP and reporting in the California School Dashboard. 3rd - 8th grade students will be given the survey in class over the next month. 




What's something that most people don't know about you?

What drew you to become a science teacher?


