## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

As I reflect on our first month of school, and my first month as your principal, I could not be more enthusiastic about and inspired by our school and community. This month also features our annual Fall Festival on October 12th, which promises to be better than ever. Mrs. Rechs, our librarian, is hosting a storybook pumpkin decorating contest, with winners earning a gift certificate to our Scholastic Book Fair in November. Students also will be bringing home information on our biggest fundraiser of the year - School Kine Cookies. The School Kine Cookies fundraiser, along with the Fall Festival, are great opportunities for everyone to show their support for Didion and the programs and field trips that are funded by the PTA. Date of Meeting: September 19, 2018
Meeting Adjourned At: 7:35 PM

1. Call to Order- $6: 00 \mathrm{PM}$
2. President's Report- (Jeff Fletcher)

- Board voted Kristi Morioka as Historian.
- Parliamentarian position is OPEN. It is a non-elected position.
- President to appoint a bylaws review committee of 3-5 people chaired by the Parliamentarian. VOLUNTEERS NEEDED.
- Position is part of the PTA Board and person is in charge of the rules of order.

3. Principal's Report- (James Eder)

- Behavior assemblies for primary, intermediate, and middle school were conducted.
- Safety on campus
- There are two locking gates that limit access and entry onto the campus.
- Provides controlled and safe exits
- Use of crosswalks is reinforced
- Traffic officers may be a presence in near future.
- Intruder training for staff will be in late October.
- Waiting for District maintanence to install locks on the classroom doors to allow teachers to lock from the inside.
- In the meantime, lockdown magnets will be ordered for the campus.
- Possible training for after school staff (i.e. non-4th 'R' staff) re: lockdown procedures.
- Communication with parents
- Robo calls
- Mass e-mail was sent for the first time
- Text blast service
- Monthly newsletter (by Julienne Ratanasen)
- Spirit Day (Friday, September 28th)
- Students to wear Didion gear or red/white/blue colors
- District is looking at data points from SBAC scores, student grades, discipline, attendance, etc, to come up with resources and interventions.

4. Treasurer's Report- (Kelvin Gee)

- About $\$ 61 \mathrm{~K}$ in our account at beginning of 2018-19 school year.
- Checks have been written for about $\$ 12.5 \mathrm{~K}$.
- Assemblies
- Teacher allotments (\$250 per teacher)
- Yearbook check from 2017-18 for $\$ 5700$ was never cashed.
- Current balance in account is about $\$ 54 \mathrm{~K}$ after deducting above expenses.

8. 2018-19 PTA Budget

- Discussion of expenses to be added and amended.
- Principal Eder discussed a needs assessment he conducted with staff and found that the cords from the LCD projectors were a safety hazard for students in the classroom.
- Contractor (from the District) came out on 09/18 to assess cost of mounting LCD projectors in each classroom.
- Principal Eder is waiting for a bid, but initial estimate is $\$ 500-600$ per classroom.
- About 20 classrooms need LCD projectors mounted.
- Principal Eder asked PTA to allocate money in the budget to mount the LCD projectors.
- Kristi Morioka initally motioned to allocated $\$ 13.5 \mathrm{~K}$ to mount the LCD projectors as a one-time expense item in the budget. Jeff Fletcher discussed possibly waiting until we find out the actual cost of to mount the LCD projectors before voting it into the budget. Motion was discussed by the PTA.
- Elaine Austin motioned to increase the allocation to $\$ 14 \mathrm{~K}$ for the mounting of the LCD projectors. Kellie Sato seconded. Motion passed.
- Kristi Morioka motioned for the following amendments to the budget:
- \$0 for Zumba
- \$1K for Didion Gear expenses
- \$14K for School Kine Cookies
- $\$ 5 \mathrm{~K}$ for Mixed Bag
- \$9K for See's Candy
- \$6K for Yearbook expense
- Stephanie Mark seconded motion as amended. Motion passed. Budget for 2018-19 approved.

9. Other Items:

- Discussion of videographer to record events (i.e. concerts, Talent Show, etc) throughout the school year and sell copies to parents/families. (Kim Tsumura will look into it.)
- Encourage parents to use receipts from Nugget (in Lakecrest Shopping Village) as "double bucks" for Shop to Educate.
